Chief's Report

The firefighters and support staff of the Wilmar Volunteer Fire Department continue to take great pride in serving our community. We currently have over 40 firefighters and support staff who respond to more than 350 emergency calls each year. Medical emergencies account for 60% of our emergency responses while fires, traffic accidents, and other hazardous incidents account for the remainder.

Our primary mission is to serve the Wilmar community. However, our firefighters respond to emergencies in Petaluma, Two Rock, Penngrove, Lakeville, and San Antonio under an aggressive mutual aid program. The mutual aid system ensures that you receive a rapid response to your emergency call for assistance.

As a result of the recent strong winds and warm temperatures, fire season quickly snuck up on us. We are already responding to vegetation fires in the Wilmar and surrounding communities. Indications are that this fire season will be a challenging one for us. We need your partnership in keeping our community safe from wildfire. He became an Explorer with Wilmar in May of 2008 at the age of 15 1/2 while still attending Technology High School in Rohnert Park (a magnet school for math, science and technology). By the time he was 16, he was cleared to respond on calls. In 2009 he attended the annual week long Explorer Academy held in Marin County that year, and was also able to attend again in Oxnard in 2011. Since then he has moved up the ranks to become a volunteer firefighter with Wilmar.

Pat's goal is to become a full time firefighter with a city such as Santa Rosa or Sacramento. His father is a Battalion Chief with the Tiburon Fire Department and thus Pat has been around firehouse stations his entire life. He says that he has wanted to be a firefighter ever since he can remember.
