Title: RESPONSE TO INDUSTRIAL SITES	Revision: 0 Date:

Purpose

To establish operating procedures related to responding to industrial sites with a trained fire brigade.

Guideline for Fires Outside the Secure Area:

Fires outside the secure area are the responsibility of this agency and will be handled in accordance with the departments established SOG's

Guidelines for Fires Inside the Secure Area (on-site)

- Apparatus will respond as per the Alarm Response Card
- No member or mutual aid member will be allowed on the plant unless they enter on an emergency vehicle – No exceptions
- On arrival at the first Chief or Officer will establish a joint command post with the Site Fire Chief
 - Site Fire Chief is responsible for operations with-in the facility and Scriba Command will coordinate incoming apparatus and personnel
 - Fires may be handed over to Scriba FD if it is determined that no special knowledge or training is required.
 - Only one County Coordinator will be allowed on-site to assist the incident commanders.
- If a working fire is confirmed activate the second alarm and have unites stage.
 - Primary Staging is the facilities parking Lot
 - During inclement weather consider staging additional units at the Fire Station
- Try as soon as possible to relieve the fire brigade members with SVFD personnel and use fire brigade members as escorts.
- Ensure personnel accountability at all times and have a minimum of a four person RIT Team with an escort available.

Guidelines for Possible or Actual Terrorist Event (Hostile Takeover)

- When possible the 911 Center will activate the SVFD and have members report to the Station and Call the 911 Center for information.
 - This is an indicator of potential terrorist type incident at the plant and all members are encouraged to use caution approaching the station and stay away if things do not look appropriate (Call 911)
 - Remember the plant may be a primary attack site and SVFD could be used as a diversionary attack or to steal apparatus
- If the alarm is for an armed conflict all units will stage a minimum of 1 mile from the facilities entry gate or property line.
- No Response should be made into the facility until cleared by law enforcement.
- If multiple injured parties are identified, follow the established Mass Casualty Plan
- Remember to preserve as much evidence as possible and have either police or security secure any weapons found.
- Leave hostile forces alone until cleared by Police (Secondary Explosives)

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Guideline for Potential / Actual Aircraft Attack (B5B)

- In the event of a possible aircraft attack on the facilities the plants will attempt to give us as much warning as possible although the target time is 10 minutes
- The 911 Center will activate the SVFD and have members report to the Station and Call the 911 Center for information.
 - This is an indicator of potential terrorist type incident all members are encouraged to use caution approaching the station and stay away if things do not look appropriate and call 911 from another location
 - Remember the plant may be a primary attack site and SVFD could be used as a diversionary attack or to steal apparatus
- Have 911 activate for 171, Sunoco, Oswego County Haz-Mat foam unit and airport crash truck and have them staged at the Scriba Station
- No response to the plants until an actual crash has occurred
 - Consider staging at Creamery Rd at CR 1 as this will allow access to all plants
 - Ensure Menter Ambulance is aware of the situation due to potential mass casualty incident
- Follow department alarm response card and move up companies as needed
- Foam should be prioritized due to limited supply. life hazard is the first priority
- The Plants fire brigade will be concerned with protection of the facility and command must ensure they have the necessary resources before concern with injuries or other parts of the plant.
- If Mass Casualty Incident exists follow the mass casualty plan and best case scenario may just be to move people rapidly off-site for triage and treatment.
- Due to lack of foam capabilities utilize large stream appliances and where possible a defensive attack.
- If site Hydrants are inoperable establish draft sites at the cooling tower for Nine Mile 1 & 2 and at the water intake at the northeast corner of J.A. Fitzpatrick passing supply lines thru the fence. (This has been approved thru fire protection)

Guideline for EMS Response if requested

- If request is for a medical emergency (heart attack / stroke) 2762 will respond and be the only unit on site.
- If the alarm involves entrapment, confined space, injury from a fall, or cannot be determined at time of call follow department APPARATUS RUN CARD.
