

**Montgomery County
Emergency Services District No. 4
Minutes from Special Meeting**

October 29, 2020

Item 1 – Call the meeting to order.

The Board of Commissioners meeting was held via videoconference pursuant to the suspension of certain provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The videoconference was recorded pursuant to the same provision suspension. The meeting was called to order at 11:00 a.m. by Commissioner Arceneaux. The Commissioners present were: Brian Arceneaux, Roxann McDaniel, Mark Abbey, and Raymond Veit.
